Weather Risk Warning - Any time there is lightning activity there is a significant risk of being struck by lightning on a golf course. It is the player's

responsibility to check weather forecasts and to ensure their own safety with regard to lightning before commencing play on the golf course. It is a condition of entry to this course that the player acknowledges not to rely on Gungahlin Lakes Golf Club (GLGC) to ensure their safety from lightning.



Monitoring of Weather Conditions -Where possible, players will be warned by the Club Pro Shop Duty Manager

before play about the potential for lightning/severe weather occurring on the golf course during the day and the potential requirement to evacuate to a safe area. Once it is known that lightning and/or severe weather is travelling towards the golf course and surrounds, no members will be permitted access to the course until it has been deemed safe.



Closure of Course

The following signals will be used:

 A suspension for a dangerous situation will be signalled by one ed air-horn note

prolonged air-horn note.

- All other types of suspension will be signalled by three consecutive air-horn notes.
- Resumption of play will be signalled by two short air-horn notes.
- Signals will be repeated

Players hearing the siren are to:


- Mark the position of their ball
- Return to the Club House, where practical, and await advice on continuation of play.

The 30/30 Rule is a mandatory requirement at GLGC. By the time the flash (lightning)-to-bang (thunder) count is 30 seconds, players should be in a safe location in the Clubhouse, and should not resume any outdoor activity until 30 minutes after the last thunder clap is heard.





- · All distances are in metres.





A shot right of the front bunker can see the ball kick into the pond. The left bunker and trussed grass provide challenging shots to hold the green. Don't be long - there is a hidden bunker right and over the green runs into the water.







Wind plays a large part where a short shot can catch the creek. A right shot can be blown into a grass bunker or onto the slope that feeds into the creek. The left side bunker is frequently visited.













A long Par 3 over a creek onto a large two-tiered green. Avoid the green side bunker on the left, with the grass bunker on the right a popular bailout. A par will be well earned if the pin is at the back.









A short par 4 where a drive too far left brings in out-of-bounds or trees that can block your approach shot. The front bunker catches anything short, and the right slope will kick the ball away from the green.

15 °355 ° 330 ° 321 ° 258 Par 4 Green depth = 26 Front -13 / Back +13 238 213 204 141 111 143 163 196 187 124 A drive down the centre right will avoid the large and deep fairway bunker.





Wind direction can vary widely on this short par 3 ensuring any shot that is not hit 'just right' will be captured by the bunkers that surround the green.
