

2026 Gungahlin Lakes Junior Open

Tournament Information and Conditions

1. The Gungahlin Lakes Junior Open is open to all Boys and Girls with a valid GA handicap who are under 18 years of age on the day of the event.
2. Competitions will be 18 Hole Stroke Event for Boys (white tee) and Girls (red tee) with a GA Handicap
3. (Depending on numbers there may be 2 divisions) and 9-hole Stableford Event (Yellow Tee).
4. Tee times will commence from approximately 9:00 am for the Stroke Event and 9:30am for the 9-hole Stableford Event (subject to change, two tee or shot gun start could be introduced depending on numbers).
5. A competitor can only win one trophy.
6. The Entry Form will not be accepted unless accompanied by the Entry Fee by 4 pm on Wednesday 23 Sept 2026 (late entries may be accepted on approval of committee).
7. The use of motorised buggies or other ride-on vehicles is prohibited unless approved by the GLGC Match Committee.
8. Play shall be in accordance with the Rules of Golf, as recognised by Golf Australia, and the Local Rules of the Gungahlin Lakes Golf Club.
9. Players must report to the Pro Shop 15 minutes prior to their tee off time. Failure to do so may result in a two-shot penalty or, in extremely late cases, disqualification.
10. In case of a draw for the Championship, winners will be decided by a play off
11. Players under 12 years are required to have a guardian/parent present at all times.
12. On completion of the round, all players are to complete their card administration (MI score) and lodge the card with the Match Committee within 15 minutes of the completion of their round 2026.
13. The tournament committee has full control of the tournament, and its decision will be final.

Guidelines for parents and spectators

1. Parents and spectators are not to walk onto any teeing ground, in the middle of the fairway with the players, or onto the green for any reason.
2. Parents and spectators must stay on the designated cart paths or walk along the tree line of a fairway to watch the players. Parents and spectators must remain at least 20 metres away from players at all times.
3. Parents and spectators are encouraged to act as spotters for errant shots and can help players search for lost balls in long grasses and penalty areas.
4. Parents and spectators are not to push a player's golf bag, offer any advice or coaching throughout the round, or get involved with any rulings or scoring disputes.
5. There will be on course volunteers, tournament staff, and designated rules officials available to assist and deal with any problems arising on the golf course.
6. Parents and spectators who are found to be crossing the clearly defined guidelines above will be given an official warning and may be asked to leave the course if the behaviour continues.
